RATIONALE

Individuals living with HIV are living longer, resulting in a significant increase in the prevalence of comorbidities, particularly non-communicable diseases, which appear earlier and more frequently than the general population. Hypertension, diabetes, non-AIDS-defining malignancies, and mental health disorders can all have a significant impact on people with HIV's health and well-being. At the same time, it is important to effectively manage and address AIDS-defining events in order to support the immunological recovery and favor the achievement of a life expectancy similar to that of the general population. This involves timely and appropriate screening, medical interventions, monitoring, and support to ensure the best possible outcomes for the individual. As a result, the purpose of this meeting is to highlight the crucial need of tailored treatments and comprehensive management strategies in the field of HIV healthy aging from a holistic perspective, aiming to achieve the "fourth 90" target recommended by the World Health Organization for 2030.
